


As we wrap up another remarkable year at Sacramento Children's Museum, I'm excited to share the impact that we, collectively, had on inspiring children's curiosity and creativity:

- We showcased two traveling exhibits: *Potter the Otter: A Healthy Adventure* and *Abuelita's Kitchen: Mexican Food Stories*.
- We upgraded our Museum campus with a new outdoor seating wall for educational programs and special events.
- Our staff participated in three professional conferences.

Program Highlight

In 2025, the Van Go program has seen a rapid 67% increase in popularity compared to 2024. We visited classrooms ranging from PreK-3rd Grade with over 22 schools on a returning rotation from previous years. Over the summer,


